#IAS_NUQ Global Undergraduate Fellowship

#IAS_NUQ Global Undergraduate Fellows pursue a solo research or evidence-based creative scholarship project on a subject of their choosing over twelve months, focussing on the Global South and addressing one or more of our current research themes:

- 1. Genealogies and Epistemologies of the Global South
- 2. Arab Media, Culture, and Politics
- 3. Southern Digitalities
- 4. Critical Security Studies

Fellowship Details

- One-year fellowship to carry out original research focused on the Global South.
- Open to advanced undergraduate students registered at NU-Q who are either Sophomore or Junior at the time of application.
- Fellows receive mentorship and financial support (including a QAR 12,000 stipend, up to QAR 5,000 for project related expenses, and one return airfare to the research site).
- Fellowship duration: one calendar year starting January.
- Fellows produce and present a tangible output (research paper, creative project/ documentary film, or multimodal digital project) with #IAS NUQ Press.
- Fellows are expected to participate in #IAS NUQ events and research groups.

Under the mentorship of #IAS_NUQ's Assistant Director for Research, #IAS_NUQ staff, #IAS_NUQ postdoctoral scholars, and NU-Q faculty mentors, Global Undergraduate Fellows develop their concept and deepen their research skills. They publish or produce the output of their projects with #IAS_NUQ_Press and present it to the NU-Q community at the annual #IAS_NUQ Global Undergraduate Fellows Presentations, held at the end of January each year.

Fellows have access to a shared workspace at the Institute dependent on needs and availability. All Fellows are expected to participate in and promote #IAS_NUQ events, to contribute to stimulating conversations and learn about theories, methodologies, and intellectual debates in, from and about the countries of the Global South.

Timeline

- Applications open in September till October.
- **December:** Decisions are announced.
- January to April: Preparation phase, including workshops and planning.
- May to August: Summer fieldwork in the designated site or area of study.
- September to December: Project development and completion.
- January (next year): Presentation of completed projects at the annual #IAS_NUQ Global Undergraduate Fellow Presentations.

Eligibility

Fellowships are open to advanced undergraduate students who meet ALL of the following criteria:

- Are either a sophomore or junior at the time of application (Fall 2024).
- Are in good academic AND financial standing.
- Are registered full-time at Northwestern University in Qatar.
